RISK BENEFITS LINKED TO MY TOP OUTCOMES: -

Play is great for children's well-being and development. When Planning and providing play opportunities, the goal is not to eliminate risk, but to weigh up the risks and benefits.

Dutcome 1 – Children have a strong sense of Identity = Water play and swimming is a wonderful opportunity for children to establish and maintain respectful, trusting relationships with peers and educators alike, through children expressing to peers and educators their own personal limits and expectations and respecting the wishes of others, children will develop a sense of belonging. Through going to Manly Surf n Slide children will be open to new challenges, discoveries and experiences, and be able to confidently explore the environment. Children will have free choice if they wish to participate in this activity, and it provides an opportunity for children to engage in leisure activities with peers at the service. Water play provides an opportunity to take risk in their decision making and to cope with the unexpected. All this ensures children *feel safe, secure, and supported (1.1)* This allows children to 'develop their autonomy, interdependence, resilience and sense of agency children to spend a large portion of their time with their peers, in a large group situation. This allows children to 'learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect' (1.4). Children will be able to develop and demonstrate negation and decision making skills. It will allow children to relax and have fun with peers in a safe and inclusive environment that will support the development of peer friendships amongst the group, and allow children the opportunity to is the children and enjoy the simple pleasures of engaging in water play.

Outcome 2 – Children are connected with and contribute to their world = By engaging in water play and swimming, children will be provided with ways that they can participate in and contribute to group activities with peers. It will provide children to learn how to negotiate roles, space and relationships in play experiences with one another, and build on their own social experiences to explore other ways of being. This activity at the service will allow us to promote a sense of community within the school age care setting, through children negotiating space, contribute to decision making about the use of this space and express opinions on matters that affect them and learning to read others behaviour and actions and respond accordingly. This all allows 'Children to develop a sense of belonging to groups and communities and understand the reciprocal rights and responsibilities necessary for active community participation (2.1). This ongoing activity will allow multiple opportunities for Children to become aware of fairness (2.3) through children being engaged in conversations about respectful and equal relations, in both spontaneous and planned discussions and experiences, between and with children and educators.

Outcome 3 – Children have a strong sense of Wellbeing = Children become strong in their social and emotional wellbeing' (3.1) through the excursion at Surf n Slide by sharing humour, happiness and joy of being with peers and enjoying time to play and have fun with peers and educators. It provides a wonderful opportunity for children to develop confidence in social environments and settings and develop trust in others that their wishes will be respected. In addition a strong sense of wellbeing will be maintained through *'children taking increasing responsibility for their own health and physical wellbeing'* (3.2). Children will be having fun, while participating in physical play that will challenge them, help develop self-confidence, in a safe environment where they can make new connections with peers. It will provide children who don't normally engage in physical play to get enthusiastic about being involved in outdoors play and for all children to seek out positive experiences.

<u>Outcome 4 – Children are confident and involved learners</u> = The venue will allow 'Children to develop dispositions such as curiosity, cooperation, confidence, creativity, commitment, enthusiasm, persistence, imagination and reflexivity' (4.1) as well as allow 'Children to use a range of skills and processes such as problem solving, inquiry, experimentation, hypothesising, researching and investigating' (4.2). The venue will provide an environment that is flexible and open ended, allowing children to experience a positive sense of self and sense of belonging, developing confidence that will allow children to experiment and challenge themselves physically. Children will be involved in a variety of experiences that will allow them to investigate and explore new ideas and physical abilities. Children will be provided with opportunities to demonstrate and develop leadership skills amongst their peers. Children will be able to make choices and take control of activities and experiences that they wish to see and engage in as a group. We will be able to make predictions about some daily activities they may undertake and what impact that will have on other living things environments. It will provide children with an opportunity to engage in reflective thinking to consider why things happen and what can be learnt from these experiences.

Outcome 5 – Children are effective Communicators = The Surf n Slide will allow children the opportunity to *interact verbally and non-verbally with others for a range of purposes (5.1)* through providing an opportunity for children that will promote social interaction with one another, and allow interaction with others to share new ideas, contribute ideas and join in small and large group discussions. It will provide opportunities for children to engage in sustained conversation with peers and educators about new experiences and Ideas as well as allow them to convey and construct messages with one another for a purpose, with growing confidence.
