Possible	Severe	Very High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Anyone who has symptoms (children, staff and parents) of COVID 19 are to not come to the service. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Instructed they must seek medical advice on symptoms and provide a clearance from their doctor prior to returning to the service. ○ If a visitor, child or staff member has been in contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days is not to return to the service until the public health authority confirms that it is safe to do so. ○ If service becomes aware of a positive case of COVID 19 that has been in our service in the last 14 days, we will immediately contact the local public health unit and/or NSW Health. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Follow all direction and advice given by them. ○ The service is to follow existing cleaning and disinfection procedures outlined in Infections Diseases policy and Hygiene and Cleaning Policy. Guidelines outlined in Staying Healthy in Childcare. ○ ACI will engage the services of an external cleaning company to give the service a deep clean.

The child will be provided with a mask, separated from the rest of the children and cared for until family arrives to collect. ○ Coordinators are to identify an area to isolate potential sick individuals prior to an event occurring and advise all staff of where this will be at their service. ○ Before returning to the service the individual must provide evidence of medical clearance. ○ The service is to follow existing cleaning and disinfection procedures outlined in Infections Diseases policy and Hygiene and Cleaning Policy. Guidelines outlined in Staying Healthy in Childcare.

<p>A Visitor, child or staff member is incubating COVID 19 and is not showing any symptoms</p>	<p>The individual is incubating COVID-19 and unknowingly spreads the disease through direct contact with people and surfaces.</p>	<p>Others are infected with COVID-19</p> <p>Visitors, staff or children come into contact with the Virus</p>	Possible	Severe	Very High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Staff are provided with cleaning agents, bins and gloves as well as procedures to follow on the correct way to clean and sanitise (See ACI Hygiene and Cleaning Policy). ○ Enhanced Hygiene practices are implemented for staff, children and visitors such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Frequent hand washing (Alcohol based hand sanitiser is a suitable alternative if used and stored safely around children). - Staff avoid touching face, handshakes and other close physical contact. - Tissues are disposed of appropriately. - Coughs and sneezes covered with elbow ○ Alcohol based hand sanitiser is available at the service entry. ○ Where possible touch points are reduced (such as leaving access doors open where possible). ○ Children are provided with increased and daily hand washing and personal hygiene guidance.

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A Visitor, child or staff member is incubating COVID 19 and is not showing any symptoms Continued....		<p>Surfaces are contaminated</p> <p>Hygiene Practices are not Consistent</p> <p>There is a lack of cleaning and hygiene products to support essential measures being implemented fully and consistently.</p> <p>There is insufficient environmental cleaning</p> <p>Children do not implement increased Hygiene Practices</p>	Possible	Severe	Very High	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Increased Hygiene and cleaning Practices throughout the service with regular cleaning throughout the session of High touch surfaces (such as family sign in and out area) and daily cleaning of used equipment and resources. ○ Service Coordinator is to ensure that there is robust control and routine cleaning of the environment on a daily basis including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Frequently touched surfaces and objects such as doors, tables, benchtops, and toys, are cleaned and disinfected at a minimum after every session using appropriate detergent and disinfectant. - That staff use gloves when cleaning and either wash hands OR use alcohol based hand sanitiser before and after wearing gloves. - Personal items such as phones, glasses, keyboards etc are cleaned and disinfected frequently (e.g. with disinfectant wipes). - Amenities including kitchens, common areas, toilets are cleaned frequently. ○ Coordinators are to ensure that all cleaning is recorded daily in the SIM (Service Instruction Manual). ○ Handwashing facilities are kept clean, properly stocked and in good working order throughout the session. ○ Management will keep staff informed of service procedures, actions to take and symptoms to be concerned about. Clear guidance is provided to ensure expectations are understood. ○ Families and parents are not to enter the service and are to wait in a designated area for drop of and collection. ○ We will limit the numbers of visitors in the service (e.g cancel excursions and incursions and contactors only called in if needed). ○ Physical distancing measures are implemented throughout the service, wherever possible. Coordinators and Staff are to work together to identify reasonable and practical social distancing measures at each service. Document this in Team Talks.
