Children will be participating in and OOSH only event where we will join other vacation care services for a fun day out of Zorb Balls, Bubble Soccer, Sumo suits, Gladiator Duels, art and craft, races, bubble play, cooking, learn about beekeeping, Farmer Dave and his Muttley crew – his rescue dog show, and Face Painting. Return to the service by charted bus. **Method of transport:** Charted bus – Baxters Bus Company.

RISK BENEFITS LINKED TO MY TOP OUTCOMES: -

Play is great for children's well-being and development. When planning and providing play opportunities, the goal is not to eliminate risk, but to weigh up the risks and benefits.

<u>Outcome 1 – Children have a strong sense of Identity</u> = Through attending the 'Fun day out carnival day' excursion children will be provided with the opportunity to 'feel safe, secure and supported' (1.1) children being provided with the opportunity to confidently explore and engage with social and physical environments through relationships and play, and staff providing supporting the development of children's friendships. This excursion will provide an opportunity for children to interact with, and develop friendships, from children from different OOSH centres across NSW, through their being a number of OOSH services attending this OOSH only event. It will also allow children to *'learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect' (1.4).* Children will engaged in, and have the opportunity to contribute to the various play experiences on offer, allowing children to spend leisure time with peers, and allow children the opportunity to have small and large group interactions, allowing for meaningful play opportunities.

<u>Outcome 2 – Children are connected with and contribute to their world</u> = This excursion will provide children an opportunity to broaden their understandings of the world through discussions and demonstrations, understanding the role animals and nature play in our society and lives, providing them with an opportunity for children to investigate ides and express ideas. It will allow children the opportunity to build connections within the wider community through interaction with other services. This excursion will allow children to develop knowledge and respect for natural environments and

explore a greater understanding and appreciation of how the land, people, plants and animals are all interdependent on one another. As this event is being held at the Macarthur centre for sustainable living, we will also explore ways we can become more sustainable, how we can embrace sustainable living and up cycle and children will be provided with access to natural materials to create. All this will indicate that children are able to 'develop a sense of belonging to groups and communities and an understanding of the reciprocal rights and responsibilities necessary for active community participation' (2.1) and 'Children become socially responsible and show respect for the environment' (2.4).

<u>Outcome 3 – Children have a strong sense of Wellbeing</u> = This activity will promote a strong sense of wellbeing; this will be maintained through *'children taking increasing responsibility for their own health and physical wellbeing'* (3.2). Children will be having fun, while participating in physical play that will challenge them, demonstrate increasing competence, confidence and skills through manipulating new equipment and tools, with the assistance, encouragement and guidance of educators and scout staff. In taking responsibility for their own wellbeing they will be able negotiate the environment, ensuring their safety and wellbeing as well as that of peers, and develop gross motor skills.

<u>Outcome 4 – Children are confident and involved learners</u> = This excursion will allow 'Children to develop dispositions such as curiosity, cooperation, confidence, creativity, commitment, enthusiasm, persistence, imagination and reflexivity' (4.1) as well as allow 'Children to resource their learning through Connecting with people, place, technologies and natural and processed materials' (4.4). Physical activity and exposure to new experiences will challenge children's belief in their own ability, and encourage children to explore, experiment and take appropriate risks. The venue will provide an environment that is flexible and open ended, allowing children to experience a positive sense of self and sense of belonging, developing confidence that will allow children to experiment and explore new ideas not just at the venue but in everyday life. Children will be involved in a variety of experiences that will both challenge them and allow them to investigate and explore new ideas and physical abilities. Children will be provided with opportunities to be involved with other services and children from all areas of Sydney, providing them with opportunities to collaborate and be involved with the wider community, beyond the school age care setting.
