<b>Risk</b>	<b>Control Measure</b>
<p><b>1.</b></p> <p><b>! Children getting hit by the games bus</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children will be kept inside the building whilst the games bus is entering and exiting the premises and will only be able to leave the building once the bus is set up and ready for use</li> </ul>
<p><b>2.</b></p> <p><b># Children absconding during the different activities being run</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children will be allocated into smaller groups to move between the different activities and an educator will be allocated to each group to supervise</li> <li>• An educator will also be floating between the environment to assist each group and to monitor areas that are not in use for the activities</li> <li>• A safety discussion will be had prior to the incursion where we will talk about appropriate behaviour, following instructions and the consequences if unsafe behaviour occurs, i.e. missing out on some of the activities</li> </ul>

<p># Children tripping/falling during the activities</p> <p>* Educators not being aware where children are during the activities</p> <p>3. * Children getting sunburnt</p> <p>4. # Bruises/cuts/scrapes when using laser tag equipment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A head count will be completed prior to the activity, during and after</li> <li>• A first aid kit will be taken outdoors for quick access should any injuries occur during the incursion</li> <li>• The outdoor environment that is being used will be checked during the morning safety inspection to ensure there are no big tripping hazards</li> <li>• Outdoor thoroughfares to be kept clear</li> <li>• Educators allocated to their groups will have a list of the children within their group so they are able to complete headcounts and keep track of the children</li> <li>• Educators will use the walkie talkies for easy communication</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The UV will be checked in the morning and should it be above 3 during the incursion then children will be required to wear hats and sunscreen</li> <li>• Water breaks will be encouraged throughout the incursion</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Safety discussion around the appropriate use of laser tag equipment will occur prior to event and children will be made aware of consequences of unsafe behaviour</li> <li>• Games 2 you instructor to complete a safety chat and how to use equipment prior to laser tag occurring. Children who do not listen may need to miss out for a short period</li> <li>• Educator to closely monitor activity and step in if needed</li> <li>• Area where laser tag will be occurring will be checked during the morning safety checklist for any hazards</li> <li>• First aid kit will be close by for easy access.</li> </ul>
